	Lesson 2 Acts of Kindness	Students define kindness and give examples. They explore actions that demonstrate kindness in school and in the community. This lesson is suitable for grades 3-5.	What does being kind mean to you?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify different actions demonstrating kindness. • Define kindness and give examples.
	Lesson 3 What is Kindness?	Students identify ways to practice kindness in school, home and in the community. They learn what kindness looks like by completing a matching activity. This lesson is suitable for grades 2-5.	Why is it important to be kind?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demonstrate how to practice kindness. • Explain the importance of being kind.

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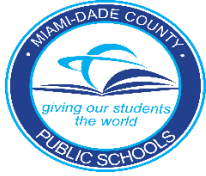
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Kindness	Digital Citizenship Lesson (K-2) Screen out the Mean	Students learn that children sometimes act like bullies when they are online. They explore what cyberbullying means and what they can do when they encounter it.	What can you do when someone is mean to you?	Students will be able to ... <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Analyze online behaviors that could be considered cyberbullying. Explain how to deal with cyberbullying situation.
	(3-5) The Power of Words	Students consider they may get online messages from other kids that can make them feel angry, hurt, sad, or fearful. Students identify actions that make them upstanders in the face of cyberbullying.	What should you do when someone uses mean or scary language on the Internet?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recognize the importance of engaging a trusted adult when they experience cyberbullying. Empathize with those who have received mean and hurtful messages. Judge what it means to cross the line from harmless to harmful communication online. Generate solutions for dealing with cyberbullying.

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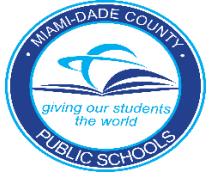
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	Lesson Title	Lesson Description	Essential Question	Lesson Targets
Fairness	Lesson 1 It's Fun To Play Fair	Students explore the meaning of fairness and identify ways to treat each other fairly. They practice vocabulary by recognizing and matching words that are related to being fair. This lesson is suitable for students in grades K-3.	What are ways that we can show fairness to each other?	Students will be able to... <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify ways to treat others fairly. Define fairness. Differentiate between fair rules and unfair rules. Learn how important it is to be a fair person. Develop solutions to unfair situations. Explain that part of being a fair person is to resolve conflicts with others.
	Lesson 2 Fairness	Students explain the difference between fair rules and unfair rules. They analyze situations that express the importance of being a fair person. This lesson is suitable for students in grades 3-5.	Why is it important to be a fair person?	
	Lesson 3 Fair Doesn't Mean Equal	Students learn how being a fair person can assist in resolving conflicts with others. They reflect on the importance of being fair by creating an acrostic poem using the first letters of the word fairness. This lesson is suitable for students in grades 3-5	How can being a fair person help resolve conflicts with others?	

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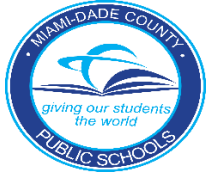
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Fairness	Digital Citizenship Lesson (K-2) Show Respect Online	Students explore the similarities and differences between in-person and online communications, and then learn how to write clear and respectful messages.	How can I make sure my online messages are clear and respectful?	Students will be able to... <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand how to show respect in social situations. Recognize the importance of tone in both face-to-face and online communications. Learn rules for writing clear and respectful emails by editing an email message.
	(3-5) Picture Perfect	Students learn how photos can be altered digitally. They will consider the creative upsides of photo alteration, as well as its power to distort our perceptions of beauty and health.	How can photos be changed on the computer, and how can that affect our feelings about the way we look?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recognize that photos can be altered digitally, and consider the upsides and downsides of this practice. Discuss how photo alteration can distort our perceptions and affect our self-image. Analyze how advertising uses photo alteration to help sell products.

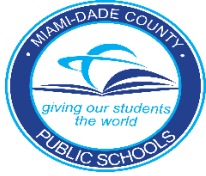

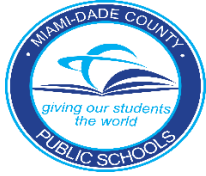
